From the Executive Director

We are now in the process of gearing up for what might be our busiest summer ever at Junior Players! We will be offering a variety of programs serving youth ages 5 to 18 and audiences of all ages. As we have told you before, there has been a lot of attention recently to summer learning loss and how it affects all students, but particularly how it affects students from low-income families. To help bridge this learning gap, Junior Players is partnering with DISD this summer for a brand new and unique summer program for middle school students, Building Connections to the Real World. Our teaching artists will be working in summer school sites teaching a variety of projects based in the creative industries. Our hope is that these projects will not only introduce students to a variety of career options, but they will also give them new skills to take back during the regular school year. We will be working at 5 DISD sites, serving approximately 2500 students.

In addition, we will have our regular' free summer theater camps throughout North Texas. We hope to have over 50 camps again this summer, but we will need your help to achieve this goal! We also just finalized our selections for our high school playwriting program with Kitchen Dog Theater, PUP Fest! Don't miss these performances on Saturday, June 15th. We are in the midst of auditions for this summer's production of Much Ado About Nothing which will run July 23-28 at Samuell Grand Park. Our director Valerie Hauss-Smith is planning a very exciting production which will be set in a Sicily, Italy in 1962. It was listed as one of Nancy Churnin's top 5 picks for amazing summer fun and she says "Not only do these talented young performers impress us with their mastery of Shakespeare's language and meaning, Junior Players incorporates a different theme or skill each year, giving us a taste of everything from Bollywood numbers to giant puppets. This year, Shakespeare will meet The Godfather in 1962 Sicily, and there'll be live music to accompany the tale of witty, verbal spar opponents Benedick and Beatrice, who have no interest in marriage or each other until tricked by their friends." We will also be providing our middle school Shakespeare Camp for students in grades 6 to 8, and last but certainly not least, we do plan to provide 52 free summer theater camps for youth ages 7 to 14 in recreation centers across North Texas.

However, we know that none of what we do would be possible without the continuing support of our Board of Directors, our staff, and our teaching artists and, of course, all of our sponsors and supporters who help us provide free arts education programs for over 5,000 youth each year. 


