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About Junior Players

Junior Players was founded in 1955, and is the oldest non-profit children's theater organization in Dallas. Over its existence, Junior Players has striven to meet the changing needs of the community. From 1955 to 1989, Junior Players presented traditional children's theater productions performed entirely by children and teenagers. In 1989, the Board of Directors changed the focus of Junior Players activities, deciding that, Junior Players can best serve the youth of Dallas by providing free programming accessible to all the children of North Texas. Junior Players, therefore, exclusively provides free arts education programs in local recreation and cultural centers, low-income housing developments, elementary and middle schools, and through social service agencies serving youth at risk.

The mission of Junior Players is to encourage intellectual growth, mental well being, and the development of life skills in the youth of North Texas through mentoring, creative expression, and participation in dramatic and arts activities.

This mission is accomplished through:

- Narrowing the arts education gap between low-income partner schools/neighborhoods and their nearby higher-income peers by providing 6,000 hours of arts education programming.
 - Teaching youth to resolve conflicts using non-violent communication strategies such as listening skills, identifying feelings and brainstorming non-violent solution options.
 - Allowing students to participate in high quality arts programming, which expand communication skills, increase self-confidence and increase self-esteem

Junior Players Programs

Junior Players Discover Theater Summer Camps and Discover Ourselves After School Workshops focus on children ages 5 to 18 in underserved areas of the community. Junior Players Discover Shakespeare program combines the best of local high-school acting talent with the professional skills of the Shakespeare Dallas staff in a teen production of Shakespeare presented in performances at Samuell-Grand Park Amphitheatre. In collaboration with a variety of organizations, including Letot, Promise House and the Dallas Independent School District, Junior Players teen and Visions of Peace programs work with high-risk teens who are challenged to write about their life experiences, create and perform their own productions and resolve their conflicts through communication in a non-violent manner. Junior Players' Advanced Acting Workshops and PUP Fest and the D-PAC collaboration (Dallas - Playwriting Arts Collective) programs offer professional training in acting and playwriting for area high school students. 2019 was the third year of the Junior Players' Youth in Arts Student Council with a focus on preparing our youth to become the next generation of arts and civic leaders with an emphasis on representation in the arts. Junior Players also offers its Fall Dance Production and Winter Musical Production to North Texas teens with the opportunity to perform at the Moody Performance Hall. In 2019, Junior Players was excited to introduce a project in collaboration with MOPAI China Dreams titled Discover Runway Dreams, a brand new runway show featuring students from a Junior Players runway modeling masterclass.

Director's Note

The title of the play can be deceptive, but also spot on.

The question or statement is As YOU Like It. It's deceptive. We ask ourselves what other people value and fear wanting something for our own gratification, be it instant or deeply necessary.

As we delve into what we value, we quickly find that there is often dissent. Not everyone agrees or supports our choices, sometimes condemning it outright.

We have two camps in our play.

The Court, with limits, restrictions and punishment around freedom of choice, expression and identity. The right to be who we are and love what we love is not guaranteed and can be stripped away or blocked upon it's arrival. The women in the play are not permitted to speak freely and there is an unequal balance of power.

The Forest of Arden is an accepting and open place that encourages true freedom to speak. We can truly be ourselves and have the space to explore what that means without judgement, fear of legal or physical repercussions, living how we like. There is support for courage of spirit, unbound thought and inclusive solutions.

Our company explores the traumatic effects of restrictions on the human spirit and the need to breathe freely, however we draw air. We explore the sheer joy and utter delight of joining communities that invite. We explore the unconditional potential for change and redemption and trust for the evolution of life. Most of all, we explore laughter, play and the pleasure of performance.




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
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What is North Texas Giving Day?
